ORDINANCE NO. 547

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 81, ENTITLED ANIMALS, OF THE
CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF DANVILLE

Section I

Chapter 81, Article I, Section 81-3, entitled Violations and Penalties, is hereby amended by replacing the existing language with the following:

Any person or persons convicted of violating this article shall be subject to a fine of \$75.00, plus the costs of prosecution, for the first violation, and of not more than \$500 for the second and each subsequent violation, together with the costs of prosecution.

Section II - All other parts of Chapter 81, of the Code of the Borough of Danville are hereby reenacted without change except as set for above.

Section III - The Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
